saalaahee saalaeh etee surat na paieeaa || One cannot gain, comprehend, or embody virtues simply by repeatedly reciting or praising them.

nadeeaa atai vaeh paveh samu(n)d na jaane'eeh || Rivers merging with the ocean are unaware of its magnanimity.

samu(n)d saeh sultaan girahaa setee maal dhan || The unlimited wealth of kings and emperors

keeRee tul na hovanee je tis manahu na veesareh ||23|| are not worth even an iota in comparison to those who do not forget the interconnectedness of the all-pervading consciousness. (23)

Essence: Guru Nanak says virtues, power, humility, and wealth reside in remembering and glorifying the universal truth of the interconnectedness of the all-pervading consciousness.

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
