A humble demeanor holds the same significance as the sacred marks from sixty-eight revered pilgrimage sites, while a heart filled with wisdom truly knows the joy of bliss.

ot matee saalaahanaa sach naam guntaas ||1||  
That understanding is praiseworthy when sincere self-reflection is valued as a virtue. (1)

baabaa hor mat hor hor ||  
O learned one, the knowledge that promotes anything other than Oneness distracts the mind.

je sau ver kamaieeaa kooRai kooRaa jor ||1|| rahaau ||

When animosity and duality are practiced, they empower the negative aspects of falsehoods. (1)(Pause)

pooj lagai peer aakheeaai sabh milai sa(n)saar ||

You can be worshipped as a spiritual teacher and receive respect from the entire world.

naau sadaae aapanaa hovai sidh sumaar ||

A popular name can be adopted and known to have supernatural powers.

jaa pat lekhai naa pavai sabhaa pooj khuaar ||2||

Even with such glories, if Consciousness, the moral arbiter, does not accept one's actions, all these praises are false. (2)

jin kau satigur thaapiaa tin meT na sakai koi ||

Those who have attained true wisdom that guides from darkness to light do not waver in their resolve.

onaa a(n)dar naam nidhaan hai naamo paragaT hoi ||

They hold within the treasure of self-reflection through which the virtue of contemplation is revealed.

naau poojeeaa naau ma(n)neeaai akha(n)D sadaa sach soi ||3||

Contemplation is a form of prayer. Self-reflection is the voice that must be heard. Those who practice this virtue are eternal and honest. (3)

khehoo kheh ralaieeaa taa jeeau kehaa hoi ||

Upon death, when the body, which is made of dust, merges with dust, what happens to the mind?

jaleeaa sabh siaanapaa uThee chaliaa roi ||

When we face death, all our clever worldly accomplishments fade into nothingness, leaving us with only the sorrow of missed opportunities.

naanak naam visaariaai dar giaa kiaa hoi ||4||8||

Nanak says, having forgotten the practice of contemplation, what will happen when one reflects within one's consciousness? (4)(8)

**Essence:** Guru Nanak highlights that self-reflection is crucial for understanding oneself and deepening consciousness. A body in self-discovery radiates purity, akin to saffron's vibrant hues. Sincere and honest speech transforms words into

treasures, while breath that transcends ego exudes a soothing, incense-like essence, inviting tranquillity.

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
