Summary: The Universal Reality serves as the foundation of all existence, inherently interconnected with it. As our beloved essence, it is always present, deeply embedded in the nature of being. However, ignorance can create a sense of separation, fostering a deep longing for something that feels lost but is simply obscured. This yearning reveals a hidden closeness. Often, what the self seeks is already within reach, lying in the silent ground of its own awareness. Embrace this truth to uncover the profound connection that has always been there.
